EMOTIONALLY BASED SCHOOL NON-ATTENDANCE TRAINING

INFANT, JUNIOR & PRIMARY SCHOOLS

This training is funded through the Inclusion Partnership, so is free to attend for Derby city schools. - How to gather information for an individual student to understand the push and pull factors around non-attendance

- Consideration of whole school approaches to prevent risk of school non-attendance
